TESSA OBERG WRITING AWARD 2012

“Tessa Oberg died at the age of twenty six years, a person of enormous grace, intelligence, decency and above all promise—a promise she never took for granted, a promise she was always cultivating.”

The College of Liberal Arts and Sciences invites students to apply for the Tessa Oberg Writing Award. Honoring the life of Tessa Oberg, a graduate of the English Department, the award is open to undergraduates who were enrolled in an LAS major either as a freshman, sophomore or junior during the spring 2012 semester and who will continue in an LAS major for the fall 2012 semester. Selection for the \$500 Tessa Oberg Writing Award for 2012 will be based upon a submitted essay of between 3,000 and 5,000 words in length of an analytical and expository nature.

To be eligible for this award, students must

- Have been a freshman, sophomore or junior student enrolled in a College of LAS major for spring 2012.
- Continue enrollment in an LAS major for the fall 2012 semester.
- Be a student in good standing with the College of LAS.
- Submit a complete application.
