

THE 2008 PROCTER & GAMBLE STUDENT RESEARCH AWARDS

The Procter & Gamble Company has generously established **one award each** for an **undergraduate** and a **doctoral** student in the School of Integrative Biology (SIB) or Molecular and Cellular Biology (SMCB). Eligible are undergraduate and doctoral students in all programs within SIB and SMCB. These **one-time awards** will provide a stipend of \$1000 for undergraduate and \$2000 for doctoral students **for research that has already been accomplished.**

To apply for a 2008 Procter & Gamble Student Research Award, submit the items below to: Procter & Gamble Awards Committee, c/o Ms. Donna Prahl, School of Molecular and Cellular Biology, B103 CLSL, MC-110 **no later than 12:00 noon on Monday, March 31, 2008.**

- 1) **Cover Sheet** with your name, e-mail address, phone number, major or degree program, dates of entry into the program, expected date of graduation, and the name and departmental affiliation of your research advisor.
- 2) **Title and Abstract** (one single-spaced page) of a research paper that you could present orally. Because the members of the award committee have diverse backgrounds, abstracts and presentations (see below) should be **geared to a general scientific audience.**
- 3) **Academic Résumé** (one to two pages) detailing your academic accomplishments, including GPA, publications, and presentations. Do not list courses taken.
- 4) **Letter of Recommendation** from your research advisor, written specifically for this award.

Up to four undergraduates and doctoral students each will be selected for 15-minute public oral presentations between **April 14 and 25** before scientists from The Procter & Gamble Company as well as the SIB and SMCB faculty.

The final awardees in the undergraduate and doctoral categories will be chosen on the basis of their scholarly achievements and research presentations. Their names will be announced on April 28, and the awards will be presented on Reading Day (Thursday, May 1st) at the SIB and SMCB receptions to honor faculty, graduate, and undergraduate award recipients for the academic year 2007-2008.
