Dietary intake and environmental exposures in early life are key to establishing trajectories for lifelong health. Childhood overweight and obesity, which affect nearly a third of 2 to 19-year-olds in the U.S., result from a complex interaction of genetic, microbial, nutritional, and physical and social environmental factors. In this presentation, Professor Donovan will discuss insights gathered from the Synergistic Theory and Research on Nutrition and Obesity Group (STRONG) Kids 2 cohort study. STRONG Kids 2 is a transdisciplinary study of 450 families that uses a cells-to-society approach and provides unique insights into how individual biology interacts with the family environment to promote healthy eating habits and growth in young children.
